




With 2020 in the rearview mirror, improvements were reported in a number of areas in the Nevada economy. New residential permits remained elevated during the first month of 2021 reaching a total of 2,029, which was 26.0 percent above their value from a year ago. Multi-family permitting volumes more than doubled to 689 while a total of 1,340 single-family units were permitted in January, representing an increase of 3.0 percent from last January. While the tourism industry continues to be hard hit, the sector posted gross casino gaming revenues of \$762 million in January. That figure remains 26.6 percent below its value from last January (pre-pandemic), but it still represents an 11.4 percent increase from a month ago. Finally, initial unemployment insurance claims continued their trend downward to the lowest level in a year. A total of 10,527 initial unemployment claims were filed in January 2021, on par with the value reported last January. This is a dramatic improvement over the 208,869 initial claims filed just a few months ago. A number of economic indicators for the month of January have yet to be released due to typical year-end processing delays. However, diminishing COVID-19 caseloads, expansion of capacity limits and other economic measures suggest broader improvements are likely to continue. While the gains are likely to be measured and may remain mixed in the coming months, there appears to be light at the end of the tunnel that increased stability is likely to prevail.




NEW RESIDENTIAL UNITS PERMITTED




TAXABLE RETAIL SALES




TOTAL EMPLOYMENT




INITIAL UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMS




UNEMPLOYMENT RATE




AVERAGE WEEKLY HOURS - PRIVATE




AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGES - PRIVATE




GROSS CASINO GAMING REVENUE




NEW SINGLE-FAMILY UNITS PERMITTED
